1-495 AMERICAN LEGION BRIDGE TRANSIT/TDM STUDY

As a compliment to the Virginia I-495 Express Lanes Northern Extension Project (495 NEXT) and the Maryland I-495 and I-270 Traffic Relief Plan, a seperate transit/Transportation Demand Management (TDM) study for the I-495 American Legion Bridge (the Bridge) is underway to identify a range of current and future transportation solutions that can be implemented to...


- Reduce congestion
- Improve trip reliability and regional connection
- Enhance existing and planned multimodal mobility and connectivity

Study potential recommendations will be made for the services that utilize the Bridge and I-495 between I-395/95 (Virginia) and I-95 (Maryland). Study potential recommendations will consider transit destinations near and connecting to I-495 (e.g. Tysons, Bethesda) and in the Washington Metropolitan Area's major activity centers (e.g. Rockville, Dulles International Airport). It will also consider connections to local and regional transit services along I-495 (existing or programmed). Potential recommendations will be regional in nature, focusing on bus and rideshare solutions that may travel across the Bridge.

The Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation (DRPT) and the Maryland Department of Transportation Maryland Transit Administration (MDOT MTA) have come together to lead these efforts.
